



Workers' Compensation Fraud

Can you identify the warning signs?

Watch for the red flags ...And immediately report any suspicious activity.

Don't be complacent about checking on an employee out on a job-related accident. Stay in regular contact to get updates on their medical conditions and employment status.

You can't prevent fraud, but you certainly can be aware of the warning signs.



Sign #1: Disgruntled Employee

If you've had to deny vacation or reprimand in any way, this employee is the quickest to turn on you.



Sign #2: Hard-to-reach Employee

If you have trouble making contact, this employee may be working another job while collecting benefits.



Sign #3: New Employee

Statistically, the newer the employee, the more likely the claim is fraudulent.



Sign #4: No Witnesses

A flag should go up if no one can corroborate the story.



Sign #5: Different Stories

The criminal usually gets caught in a lie. If the story varies from you, to the doctors, other employees or if a witness paints a different picture, beware.



Sign #6: Accident Day

Accidents happening on a Monday or Friday should raise an additional red flag.
